One Year of Compassion:

The First Patient at The Star Hospice House

s we celebrate the first anniversary of The Star Hospice House, CHPC had a conversation with Jessica Dayton, the granddaughter of TSHH's first patient, Nancy Neal. Nancy, a lively and self-reliant 92-year-old, had spent her entire life in Lakewood, living in the very home where she was born. When she was diagnosed with stage four pancreatic cancer, her family faced a tough decision about her care.

Choosing not to pursue treatment at her age, Nancy received in-home care while her family took turns supporting her. The in-home help was excellent, but as her needs grew, it became clear that she required a higher level of care. The Hospice staff, along with the in-home care team, stepped in with compassionate support.

One of Nancy's caseworkers suggested The Star Hospice House, which was soon to open—an environment more like home than a nursing facility. The family decided to wait, hoping to provide Nancy with the comfort of familiar

surroundings in her final days. In July, Nancy moved into The Star Hospice House, and it filled her heart with joy.

The Star Hospice House, with its peaceful atmosphere and caring staff, became a sanctuary for Nancy. She cherished being close to the area she had always known, surrounded by the love and support of her nearby family. The personalized care from the staff left a lasting impression on her, and she formed a special bond with the compassionate team members.



7 Ways Anger is Ruining Your Health

1. An angry outburst puts your heart at greater risk--people with anger proneness as a personality trait were at twice the risk of coronary disease.

2. Anger ups your stroke risk--One study found there was a three times higher risk of having a stroke from a blood clot to the brain or bleeding within the brain during the two hours after an angry outburst.

3. It weakens your immune system -- in healthy people, simply recalling an angry experience from their past caused a six-hour dip in levels of the antibody immunoglobulin A, the cells' first line of defense against infection.

4. Anger problems can make your anxiety worse-- anger can exacerbate symptoms of generalized anxiety disorder (GAD), a condition characterized by an excessive and uncontrollable worry that interferes with a person's daily life.

5. Anger is also linked to depression -- Numerous studies have linked depression with aggression and angry outbursts, especially in men.

6. Hostility can hurt your lungs -- Researchers theorize that an uptick in stress hormones, which are associated with feelings of anger, creates inflammation in the airways.

7. Anger can shorten your life--couples who hold in their anger have a shorter life span than those who readily say when they're mad.

The Dos and Don'ts of Anger

Express how you feel clearly and concisely.

Recognize your early signs of anger to stop it from escalating.

Take a time-out for at least 20 minutes to calm down.

Find healthy outlets like vigorous exercise, or writing to express it safely.

Make amends by acknowledging abusive anger. Don't blame others for how you feel.




Don't ignore feelings because they become stress and unresolved hurt.



Don't just leave. Let them know you need a break.

Don't use swearing, threatening gestures, block exits, or make physical contact.



Addressing anger can provide structure to grief

I suggest you not only accept your feelings of anger but use them to help you focus during the scattered crazy-making period of your early grief. The next time your mind is hijacked by anger, grab a pen and paper and ask yourself the following questions.

Are my thoughts based on assumptions, misinformation or facts?

Am I expecting too much of myself or another?

Am I entranced by the power I feel when angry?

Is my anger really a cover for what I fear?

Is there a genuine problem that needs my attention immediately? If not, is there value in my reassessing the situation again later?

It is always good to question your thoughts. Remember: you question others' thoughts on a regular basis so why not your own?

Having a conversation with yourself sends a signal to your brain that you are interested in thinking clearly once again; that you intend to accept your feelings of anger, but you want to put a bit of distance between the feeling and your response.
